Did you know?

When you register to play for Cashmere Technical (or you register your child to play), you are joining a Club with all of the rights and responsibilities that go with membership.

What does that mean?

We are an Incorporated Society with a Constitution that sets out our governance structure, membership and other important rules. Every member has a vote.

We must hold an Annual General Meeting at which we elect the office holders and Board members. We also have to file annual accounts.


We are registered for GST and must file regular returns. As we employ staff, we also have obligations under ACC, Health and Safety and PAYE.

In effect, we are a small business with very similar reporting and management requirements.

All of this takes time, commitment and resources.


Where do we get our income from?

Most of our income comes from player subs and grant funding. Other sources of income include holiday programmes, skill centres, player Academy fees and gear sales. Here is a summary of income from our most recent financial statements:



Where do we spend our money?

Our main costs are affiliation fees, coaching costs (including salary), playing strip and equipment, rent and other expenses. Here is a summary of expenditure:



Our income from player subs (at current levels) does not cover our expenses. For example, subs only cover about a quarter of our expenses and half of our income comes from grants

We need more help!

We are one of the largest sports clubs in the South Island with nearly 1700 playing members.

In 2022 we entered 80 teams into the local competition from the Mainland Premier League in both men's and women's leagues right down to 10th grade. In addition, we organised a total of 70 teams in our "in house" competition held at Centennial Park.

Each year, a small and dedicated group of volunteers place over 1500 junior players into teams, arrange over 140 bags of gear, including shirts, bibs, balls, cones and other playing equipment.

We deal with hundreds of registrations, thousands of emails from parents and players, and we cajole, coerce and persuade people to coach and manage teams. A small number of people spend thousands of hours doing these tasks on a voluntary basis.

We have the equivalent of 3 full time paid staff – if we were a high school, we would have a staff of around 84!

We rely **heavily** on volunteers. All of our grade managers, committee members and Board members are volunteers. The majority of our coaches are volunteers as are our team manager, and referees.
